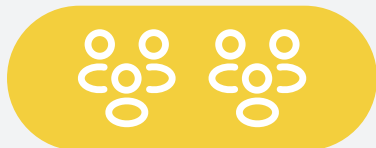


Ethical Conduct

2001



Al-Mustapha Institute of Brisbane was first established and registered.

2012



Registered as a not-for-profit organisation with the Australian Charities and Not-for-Profits Commission (ACNC).
Recognised as a registered training organisation providing certified Islamic education courses, first in Qld.

2022



10 Estramina Road, Regents Park was purchased. Building was demolished in preparation for construction.

2009



Purchased 39 Bushmills Court, Hillcrest and established the first Islamic Centre in this area providing Islamic education and services to the local community.

2016



Due to major growth in the community, we identified the need to expand to a larger facility. The search began for a property that aligned with community needs and planning regulations.

2023



Logan City Council granted Development Approval for 10 Estramina Road, Regents Park for a Material Change of Use and Operational Works.

The development site is located in the State of Queensland, Australia. Regents Park, is a suburb in the City of Logan, 30 km from Brisbane's central business district.

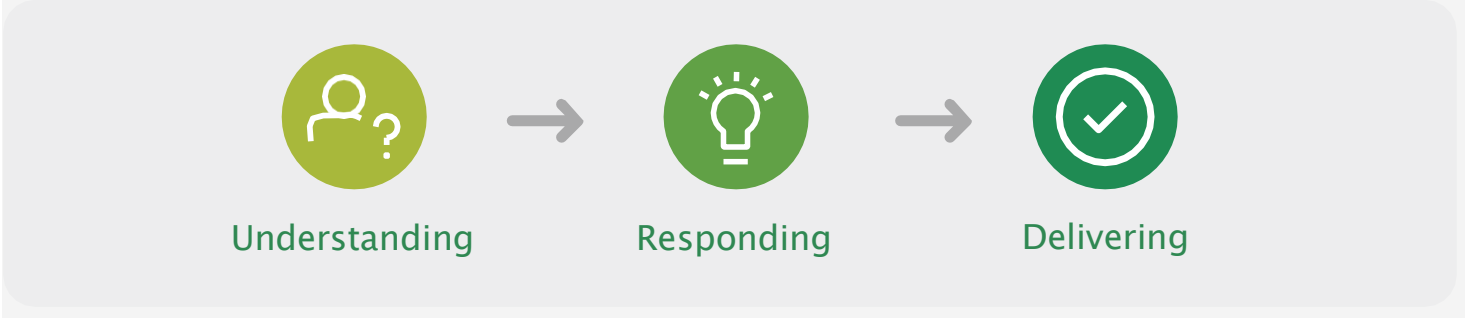
Our Approach

Introduction

In 2022, Al-Mustapha Institute purchased land at 10 Estramina Road, Regents Park, with full Council approval for development.

This new site represents not only additional space, but a once in a generation opportunity to build a purpose-designed centre that reflects both our Islamic heritage and our Australian identity.

This building marks the emergence of a uniquely Australian Islamic design, preserving core Islamic design philosophy, merged with modern Australian architecture.

This centre will include:

- A modern hall
- Space for classrooms
- A library
- Janaza facilities
- A community kitchen

With wide verandas for gathering, ample parking, and dedicated spaces for youth and families, this project is designed to meet the needs of today while laying foundations for future generations.

This is more than a building. It is an investment in our children, our community, and our future. It is a space where faith, education, culture, and service come together, ensuring that the values passed down for over 120 years will continue to flourish in Queensland.

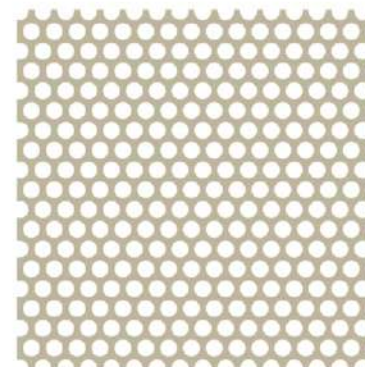




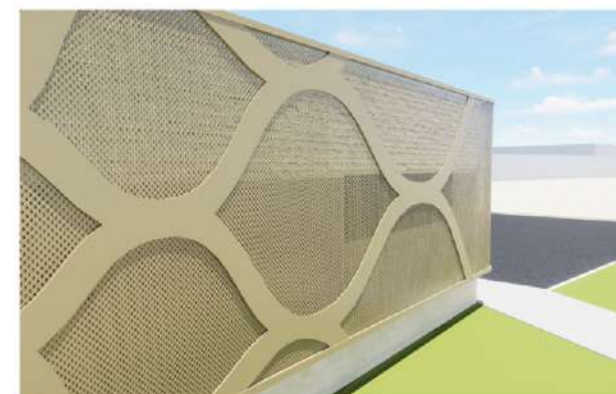
